Robert Fulford, D.O. (1905-1997) was an important, if enigmatic, figure in late twentieth-century osteopathy. Trained at the Kansas City School of Osteopathy and Surgery (class of 1941), he was a strong believer in the triune nature of man—physical, mental, and spiritual—and the importance of diagnosing and treating the whole person, not just the
