up quickly in just one or two evenings, and it only requires the most basic of knitting loom stitches: knit and purl. The zig-zaggy chevron texture is achieved through judiciously-placed purl stitches among the knit stitches. The project is worked on a Martha Stewart knitting loom, which allows you to customize the peg configuration with different colors – this makes it easier to keep track of the stitch pattern – although a savvy loomer could substitute a loom of similar gauge. Put

your feet up in front of the fire, pour yourself a cup of tea, and knit up this cozy neckwarmer. You ’ ll be wearing it outside against the elements within a day or two!
